Careers Education Summit for the Boreal Region

On October 17-18th, 2017 Inside Education brought the 8th rendition of the Alberta Boreal Careers (ABC) Project to the Lac La Biche region in Alberta! Since the beginning of the project in 2013, ABC has been to Grande Prairie, Conklin, Whitecourt and Peace River regions as well.

ABC is a careers education program designed for junior and senior high school students living in and around the boreal region of Alberta. Through ABC, students are able to explore the variety of natural resource related careers in northern Alberta, allowing for them to begin planning their career paths. Students are given the opportunity to **engage** with professionals working in the boreal region, to **explore** opportunities for careers in the region and to have day-in-the-life **experiences** in these careers.

Inside Education believes in inspiring students to consider these career paths as a way to become lifetime stewards of their environment and natural resources. By allowing students to have first-hand experience with these careers, and by providing resources that allow students to make informed decisions about their careers, Inside Education is proud to support students in searching for their career path.

Program Goals

- Introduce students to natural resource careers
- 2. Connect students to actual employees/ employers to ask questions
- 3. Understand a sense of work life in the boreal
- 4. Identify the career planning steps required to work in these sectors






Program Evaluation
