Introduction

Inside Education developed the ACES Summits as a model to engage youth across the province and introduce students to sustainability initiatives in their region. Each summit explores the local initiatives and innovations that are underway to combat climate change, reduce emissions, improve energy efficiency, and more! The program introduces students to a variety of perspectives related to climate change that have an influence on our economy, environment, and society.

Building upon 33 years of experience designing experiential education programs using a multiple perspectives approach, Inside Education endeavored to provide students with a comprehensive overview of climate change examined through a local lens.

The Calgary Climate Change (C3) Youth Summit saw another very successful year, and we are pleased to share the outcomes, challenges, and impacts from this program through this summary report.

The Program

Through this program students:

- CONNECTED with other like-minded peers who were eager to learn and share ideas about climate action.
- DISCOVERED some of the ways that Calgary is planning to mitigate and adapt to the impact of climate change.
- PARTICIPATED in a unique session where they had the chance to speak with professionals working in the energy industry.
- CONSIDERED issues and innovations through tours and discussions with a variety of speakers.
- SHARED challenges they face within their own schools and communities and brainstormed ideas to take action on these issues.

Inside Education created a unique student learning event that inspired conversations, ideas and classroom connections. Students were challenged to think critically about the content and perspectives that were presented throughout the program and had the opportunity to engage with a variety of professionals and other youth working on initiatives in the City of Calgary.




Program Impact and Feedback

Following the program, Inside Education sent out a follow-up survey to all participants who attended C3. Results of the survey indicate that, overall, C3 participants developed many ideas for leadership projects to take back to their schools and that they left feeling more empowered to get involved in sustainability or climate change initiatives in their communities. Ninety two percent of respondents would recommend the program to other students and teachers in the future.

Participants indicated that they thoroughly enjoyed touring interesting sustainability initiatives, most especially the ZEUS Electric Motorcycle Workshop tour at the University of Calgary. Many participants also indicated that their favourite part of the program was chatting with Cenovus employees and hearing from local Youth Changemakers, Jade Janzen and Priya Migneault.

Considerations and the Future

C3 has seen increasing success and interest over the past four years, with our applicants numbers increasing from 8 applicant schools in 2016 to 20 applicants in 2019. This is a demonstration not only of the high quality programming, but also the impressive word of mouth network between teachers. This year, however, schools were faced with unexpected budgetary changes in November, which forced a few of our Calgary Board of Education teachers to scale back or recant their school's participation. Almost all of them expressed the inability to cover transportation or supply teacher subsidy costs. In the future, it would be prudent for Inside Education to explore covering a higher percentage, or even the full cost, of supply teachers for attending schools.

The future of C3 looks bright; it is a highly regarded event that is gaining more and more traction among schools, students, and teachers with each passing year. One of our biggest challenges is logistics: finding a venue to support an increasingly large event is difficult, yet it speaks volumes about the potential scale of this event. Schools are actively seeking out reliable programs, events, and guest speakers for science-focused, fact-based natural resource education. Inside Education is well-poised to continue to take on the role of supporting teachers as they build future generations of engaged stewards. Events like C3, in tandem with our in-class presentations, learning resources, and field trips, are helping to inspire students and teachers who think critically about our environment and natural resources and their relationship with our economy and society.
