

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Forests, Forestry & Wildlife

July 6, 2021 | Kananaskis, Alberta

21 teachers from across Alberta spent the day at the Jumpingpound Demonstration Forest to deepen their understanding of Alberta's forestry sector and connections to wildlife to bring forest education to life in their classrooms.

The 2021 Forests, Forestry & Wildlife teacher professional development program was designed not only to offer teachers insights into forest management and forestry in Alberta but also to support forest education in an unprecedented school year. This Inside Education program was our first in-person professional development program in 2021 and for many teachers it was the first time they had an opportunity to connect with educators outside of the their own school districts as well as participate in an outdoor experiential education experience.

Building upon 34 years of experience designing experiential education programs using a multiple perspectives approach, Inside Education focused on connections between forest stakeholders, water and wildlife while showcasing activities and resources that support the classroom.

We are excited to share the outcomes and impacts from this unique teacher professional development program. The demand for this program in addition to overwhelmingly positive feedback from teacher participants indicates a strong desire for future teacher professional development on a wide range of forest topics.
