## Introduction and Program

Inside Education is proud to report on our Spring 2023 Teacher Professional Development opportunity that was hosted in Red Deer from June 1-3.

A series of knowledgeable speakers and workshops on topics such as watershed issues like allocation, native and invasive species in aquatic ecosystems and tracking watershed health provided foundational information and inspiration for activities to bring back to the classroom.

The tours immersed participants in the worlds of waterfowl research, hydroelectricity, and of wastewater treatment from both the municipal sector and the agricultural sector.


# The Participants


