Inside Education is pleased to report on this, our second successful agriculture themed teacher professional development program in the 2022 calendar year! The evolution in pandemic adaptation has happily seen the return of, and significant interest in in-person teacher PD programming. Inside Education is thrilled to find continued demand for hands-on, experiential learning for Alberta teachers.

The purpose of the Agriculture in Alberta program was to introduce teachers to the diverse world of modern agriculture in Alberta while providing teachers background knowledge and tools to supplement agriculture education and project-based learning in their classrooms.



The Program

Through this program **33 educators** had the opportunity to connect to local agriculture projects through speakers, tours, and a resource sharing session where organizations with agriculture classroom resources were given a chance to share their offerings with participants. The intent was for participants to leave the program with first hand experience interacting with local producers and tools to translate those interactions into enhancing their classroom lessons.

Effort was made to incorporate diverse types of agricultural practices highlighting topics like innovations and sustainability. This goal brought the tour to a climate controlled mushroom farm, a regenerative farm in the middle of Calgary, a ranch where native grasslands are protected with grazing cattle, and much more!






Impact
