STUDENT FOREST FIELD TRIPS

Seven weeks of experiential learning field trips for students to gain first-hand information about Alberta's forests at four different forest field sites across the province.

After a year and a half of pivoting forest education programming to fit into a virtual space, Inside Education was thrilled to get back to *in-person learning* and get outside with students from across Alberta with a return to forest field programming.

With many additional health and safety measures in place, Inside Education was able to provide interactive and hands-on forest field programming for students at four field sites across the province.

**Huestis Demonstration Forest,
Bunchberry Meadows Conservation Area,
Des Crossley Demonstration Forest,
Jumpingpound Demonstration Forest.**

This 2021 fall field season saw more than **2,100 students** attend programming at these four forest field sites. The ongoing pandemic was a factor in the number of classes who were able to come out with ongoing restrictions. Overall, there was a huge amount of interest and uptake for our forest field programs.

PARTICIPANTS AND PROGRAM IMPACT

104 different classes from **42 unique schools**, reaching a total of **2,193 students** from grade four to twelve attended forest field programming over the course of seven weeks. Each class received a program designed to meet and enhance grade level curriculum topics.






PROGRAM FEEDBACK
