Introduction

Inside Education's Spring of 2023 forest field trips were a resounding success in fostering environmental and natural resource literacy among students across Alberta. These curriculum-linked educational programs aim to provide students with immersive and hands-on experiences in the forest, enabling them to deepen their understanding of ecosystems, sustainable forestry practices, and the diverse uses of land.

These forest field trips have proven to be instrumental in cultivating the next generation of environmental stewards. The goal of this document is to report on the impact of the program and share outcomes as well as feedback.

With over **4,000 students from 77 schools in 23 different communities**, the season was highly successful. Students from Grades 4-12 had the opportunity to visit one of our 8 forest field trip sites across Alberta.

Like all Albertans, we were impacted by the wildfires and resultant poor air quality throughout the spring. We were forced to cancel a number of programs and we adapted eleven field trips, representing 12% of all classes, to indoor programs. This highlights the importance of educating future generations about stewardship and the connections between natural resources, forest management, and climate change.



Des Crossley Demonstration Forest (Rocky Mountain House)

As a former research site, Des Crossley Demonstration Forest is a valuable tool for teaching forest management to Alberta students, giving them a firsthand look at the effects of different management techniques.

Always a popular field trip site, in spring of 2023 Inside Education hosted students from ten communities in the central Alberta area, including nine rural schools and one Indigenous school.

Edmonton-Area Forest Field Trips

Edmonton-area schools have the option of programming either at Cooking Lake-Blackfoot Provincial Recreation Area east of the city, or at Bunchberry Meadows Conservation Area southwest of the city. Both are beautiful, diverse sites, and this option gives additional accessibility and reduces the cost of busing for Edmonton-area schools.

This spring we experienced extremely high demand for these programs, and in particular the number of senior high students at Edmonton-area field sites more than quadrupled over 2022. Participants at Cooking Lake-Blackfoot and Bunchberry - Spring 2023

Participants at Evergreen - Spring 2023

Located just outside the City of Grande Prairie, the Evergreen Learning and Innovation Centre serves as a hub for innovative research, processes, and practices in natural resource industries.

Field trips to this site in particular were heavily impacted by poor air quality due to wildfire smoke, with half of the classes receiving adapted classroom programs, and many other getting rescheduled. Despite this, the northwest Alberta educator was able to deliver field trip programming to more than 400 students.

Jumpingpound Demonstration Forest

Jumpingpound Demonstration Forest offers a unique opportunity for students to witness various stages of forest regeneration and explore the diverse landscape uses within the area, with tree harvesting, grazing, a pipeline, and recreation all taking place on or nearby the site.

Due to its close proximity to Calgary, there is generally overwhelming demand for forest field trips at Jumpingpound Forest - many schools return for programming year after year, but effort is always made to ensure that new schools have a chance to book field trip programs at this busy site.

Summary & Futures

The Inside Education is preparing for the our fall student field trips and the upcoming school year. In 2023-24, some K-6 classes will be piloting the new Alberta Program of Studies, necessitating revising elementary forest field trips to ensure that they align with the updated learning outcomes. These updated programs will be available alongside our existing offerings during the curriculum transition. We are pleased to share that field trips have already been scheduled at all of our sites for Fall 2023, including some classes that required rescheduling due to poor air quality during the spring from forest fires in the province. We eagerly await the opportunity to welcome schools back to our forest field sites in just a few short weeks.

Forest field trips continue to be a robust part of Inside Education's suite of programming, and we look forward to continually finding new and innovative ways to teach about forests and forestry to Alberta students and teachers.
