STEVE'S CAREER MILESTONES

- 1992:** Steve begins his career at Inside Education (at the time FEESA)
- 1995:** Steve creates and delivers one of the first caribou species at risk education programs in Alberta
- 1997:** Steve establishes forest field trips at Jumpingpound Demonstration Forest, facilitating land-based learning. This learning model has since been replicated at six other sites across Alberta
- 2005:** Steve becomes the Executive Director of Inside Education.
- 2011:** Steve brings his vision of youth environmental leadership to life through award-winning youth education summits.
- 2012:** Inside Education wins ECO Canada's Canadian Environmental Employer of the year award, thanks to Steve's leadership and the company culture he cultivated.
- 2016:** Partners with local airsheds to develop a Citizen Science Program - Clean Air Responsible Schools (C.A.R.S), including school idle-free campaigns!
- 2020:** Steve helps expand Inside Education's youth programming to include agriculture education with the launch of the first Cultivate: Youth Agriculture Leadership Summit.
- 2023:** Steve is awarded the Emerald Lifetime Achievement Award for Environmental Excellence and the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal.
- 2024:** Steve announces his retirement from Inside Education.




LEARNING RESOURCES


